The Oakleigh Grammar journey



We are dedicated to building resilient lifelong learners, responsible global citizens and empowering young minds. Students are educated to recognise their own unique talents and leadership potential, and to strive for their personal best.

Leadership development at Oakleigh Grammar begins in the early years as we adopt the Leader in Me program based on Stephen R. Covey's The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People. This program continues throughout the Middle and Senior School with a focus on the Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens.

We are proud to be the first Independent School in Australia to be accredited as a Leader in Me Lighthouse School. We encourage our students to showcase initiative and creativity to develop the skills to find their voice and encourage others to find theirs.

Early Learning Centre

Our ELC adopts the principles of the Reggio Emilia approach, supported by the **Explore** phase of the Junior School Quartet. In these years the academic, physical and socio-emotional learning process begins to evolve and students begin to see themselves as lifelong learners. Our teachers work collaboratively with the Junior School to prepare students for a semester of transition into Prep at Oakleigh Grammar.

Standard hours 9.00am to 3.00pm

Prep to Year 5

From Prep to Year 2, educators adopt the **Engage** phase of the Junior School Quartet Model using an 'explicit instruction' approach. Students acquire reading, writing and mathematical skills.

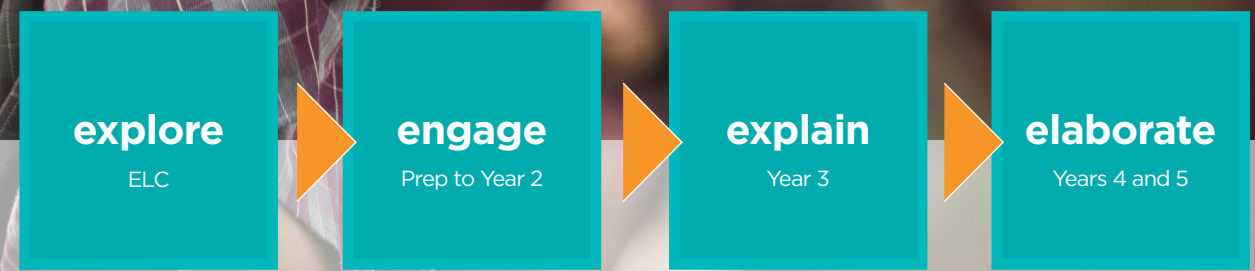
In Year 3 students enter the **Explain** phase of the Junior School Quartet Model. Students work towards a balance of learning explicitly from educators and applying their understanding across all curriculum areas.

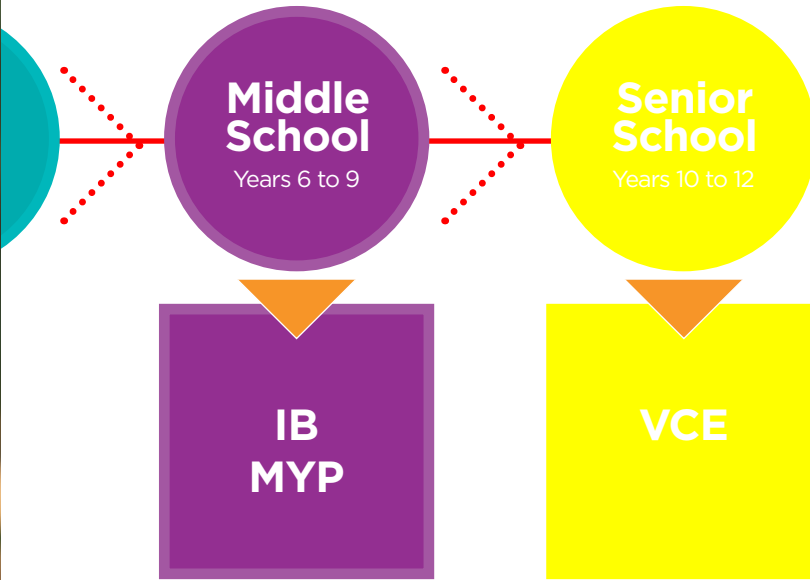
Years 4 and 5 implement the last phase of the Junior School Quartet Model: **Elaborate**. Aply guided by educators, students take more responsibility for their learning, build their confidence and consolidate their knowledge and skills. Our forward thinking and internationally-minded students are set up for success as they transition into Middle School.

Junior School

Learning in our Junior School is underpinned by our proprietary Junior School Quartet Model, developed by our award-winning Deputy Principal – Professional Culture and Junior School, Shelley Parkes. The Quartet sees teaching and learning in the Junior School progress through four learning phases, tailored to developmental age and stage from Early Learning to Year 5.





Middle School

Years 6 to 9 are characterised by rapid change as Middle School students approach early adulthood – they become more aware of their world and channel their interests into practical and collaborative learning. This is aided by the introduction of electives, providing students with an opportunity to discern learning preferences. Higher order thinking develops with teacher encouragement.

Students are encouraged to develop leadership and a sense of service to their community within the School and further afield.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) prepares students in Years 6 to 9 for the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) by developing young people who are creative, critical and reflective thinkers. The MYP is a challenging framework that encourages students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world; developing international mindedness, leadership, purpose, and a spirit of service to their community within the School and further afield.

Senior School

Recognising the link between positive teacher/student relationships and VCE success, our dedicated staff work to ensure that students are given the individualised learning and pastoral support they require in the final years of schooling. The Careers Department assists students in shaping their final years of secondary study to complement their career ambitions.

Undertaking the VCE, Senior School students are given the opportunity to complete extension studies, with capable Year 10 students given the option to include VCE units in their study programs, allowing them to shape their final scores from an earlier stage in their education. Oakleigh Grammar offers approximately 20 different studies from which to select a VCE program. These include English, Arts, Humanities, Mathematics, Science, Technology, Languages, Health and Physical Education.

Students are challenged to understand and clarify their individual beliefs and moral code. They develop an understanding of the importance of role modelling to younger students. Leadership within year levels and of the student body are the responsibility of all Senior students.

specialist support

Arrowsmith

We offer the renowned Canadian-developed Arrowsmith Program, addressing dyslexia, dysgraphia, auditory processing and memory. Combining cognitive enhancement with mainstream studies, students can integrate, reconnect and succeed in a mainstream learning environment.

International

With a small number of international students, students are fully immersed in an environment that maximises opportunities to practise speaking the language. International students bring a unique perspective that helps our local students broaden their frames of reference. Students who do not have a family member living in Australia stay with a suitable local family through Homestay, so they enjoy a family living arrangement similar to their local peers.

learning spaces

N P Nikolakakis Centre for Academic Excellence

The jewel of our campus is our innovative purpose-built Centre for Academic Excellence opened in 2023, providing a dedicated learning space for our VCE students to focus and excel. The two-storey learning space features abundant natural light and multi-purpose areas for our students to meet, collaborate, study and learn.



Science and Technology

With a dedicated science wing, students have access to the latest technologies allowing them to be part of a fast-paced learning environment.

Arts and Design

For those students with creative interests, we offer dedicated art studios and design workshops. Our students have created impressive works under the guidance of our educators who are highly experienced in fostering students' creative passions.

Sports Complex

Our sports facilities include a full gymnasium and multipurpose sports complex, rock climbing wall, outdoor futsal court and basketball/netball courts. We also have convenient access to a number of nearby community sporting facilities.



Multipurpose Library

Our spacious multipurpose library boasts meeting rooms, private study pods, reading nooks and lots more. It is a favourite spot for many of our students to read, study in solitude, collaborate with peers, take classes, and meet friends.

Other Facilities

Cafeteria

We are in the early phases of constructing a new eat-in cafeteria where students can eat lunch brought from home or purchase nutritious meals. The cafeteria will be a true community space where family and friends will be encouraged to share a coffee before or

Oakleigh Grammar boasts a range of activities and events which provide regular opportunities to build relationships, community spirit and sense of belonging for students, staff and the overall community. These include regular events such as interschool sports, House activities and carnivals, camps and school excursions.

Sport

Oakleigh Grammar participates in several interschool sporting competitions in a range of sports. For our older students, we participate in the Eastern Independent Schools of Melbourne (EISM) competing with 22 other independent schools within school hours. The EISM is the largest association of its kind in the Victorian independent schools network. Our Years 5 and 6 students compete against local primary schools within the Bentleigh District.

Camp

Camps begin in Year 3 and focus on experiential learning, teamwork and the development of character and independence. Camps continue through to Year 12 and are held in a variety of environmental settings.

Extra-curricular

Our extra-curricular activities offer more than an opportunity for students to pursue their passions. They allow students to develop social, intellectual and technical skills. Our extra-curricular activities encourage students to improve their communication, performance, creativity, decision-making, teamwork and leadership skills.

Just some of these include choirs, creative and performing arts, sports, computer games, media, dance, board games and more. Oakleigh Grammar is a leading school in the Debating Association of Victoria competitions.

We foster a close-knit community, with students at all year levels interacting on a daily basis.

Transport

Oakleigh Grammar School bus

Our level of personalised service extends beyond the classroom, with a door-to-door bus service. Students are collected from and dropped off to their front door to reduce the burden on parents and guardians. There is a small additional cost for this bus service.

Train

The School is well serviced by public transport with Hughesdale train station just 600 metres away (7-minute walk) and Oakleigh station just 700 metres away (8-minute walk).

Before and after school care

Our before and after school care is offered onsite to students from ELC to Year 5. The quality of our centre is designed to harness our students' interests.

Before school care is available from 8.00am, and after school care is offered until 6.00pm.



scholarships

Oakleigh Grammar offers scholarships to students who are talented, motivated and civic-minded, and who have the potential to make a positive contribution in a leadership and academic capacity, becoming part of our close-knit community. Our scholarships are granted to a handful of talented and passionate students who wish to excel in their learning journey, be it in sport, science, art, or community service.

Academic Excellence

We offer these scholarships through the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) for students entering Years 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10. Applications open in November and close in February the year before entry.

Junior School Scholarship

Scholarships are open to students in Years 4 to 5 who demonstrate commitment and passion to learning and developing proficiency in one of the following: languages, sport or academic pursuits.

Sport Scholarship

Scholarships are open to students who excel in, and have a passion for sport. Students must demonstrate a commitment and enthusiasm to learning, while actively developing further proficiency in their sport.

where to from here

Our enrolment process is quite straight forward. We are a non-selective, open-entry school that welcomes students of all abilities, religions and cultures.

1 Visit

2 Apply

If you decide that Oakleigh Grammar is right for your child, we encourage you to submit your application early to avoid disappointment. You can apply at www.oakleighgrammar.vic.edu.au/apply. A deposit of \$100 is required to submit your application.

3 Interview

You and your child will be invited to come to our campus to meet our Admissions staff and Principal. You'll have the opportunity to ask any questions about life at Oakleigh Grammar.

4 Offer

In Term 3 the year prior to entry, we will advise you if your application has been successful. You will need to pay Term 1 fees for the following year to secure your position.

5 Welcome

We welcome you to the Oakleigh Grammar family. In Term 4 the year prior to entry, your child will be invited to our campus to meet teachers and students and get a feel for their new school.
